### Andy Fisher Technology Award

This award recognized a Wyoming library that accomplished a significant technology related project completed within the last two years. Andy Fisher was the Wyoming State Librarian from 1963 through 1967. He was a Wyoming native and a graduate of the University of Wyoming. After leaving Wyoming State Library he became the Regional Program Officer in Denver for the Library Services and Construction Act (LSCA) for the states of Colorado, Idaho, Montana, Utah, and Wyoming. He was honored with the WLA Meritorious Service Award for 1968. The award was created in 1979 and first presented in 1980. The award was a traveling painting of the Grand Tetons by a former Wyoming artist.

## Newbie Award

The Newbie Award was developed to recognize the efforts of a library employee who worked in the library profession or field for less than six years and made significant contributions to the organization. The award provided an opportunity for WLA to recognize an outstanding young person who made a library in Wyoming better. The **Above and Beyond** Award was issued in 1982 and 1983. The "**Award**" **Award** was established in 1984 to replace the "Above and Beyond" award and was a general catch-all for anyone who deserved an award, but whose achievement didn't fit any other category. Awards were given for a humorous or horror story, a major or minor achievement or a noble deed. In 2010, the **Newbie Award** replaced the "Award" Award.
